Competing in his sixth season for the 2007-08 season, Brock Kreitzburg won a total of nine medals on World Cup tour- four in two-man, five in four-man- with driver Steve Holcomb. Kreitzburg and Holcomb claimed 2007 World Cup 2-man and combined title and finished second overall in World Cup standings in four-man. Kreitzburg participated in a Tampa Bay Buccaneers mini-camp in 1999 and decided to take on the sport of bobsledding in 2002. His superior athletic background and talent has helped him reach great success on the U.S. bobsled team. He is an Olympian from the 2006 Winter Games in Torino, placing seventh with driver Todd Hays. Kreitzburg graduated from the University of Toledo in 1999 with a degree in elementary education. He earned his master's of divinity from Gordon Conwell Theological Seminary in 2003 and served as a chaplain at a retirement community. Kreitzburg was an asset to football and track and field at Toledo, earning all-conference honors as a wide receiver and a decathlete in addition to being academic all-conference for all four years.
